

1895. TUESDAY, DECEMBER 10, 1889

Tuesday Aug 27th No Observation
Today fresh breeze from the E. N. East.
Steering W. I West. At 6 1/2 A.M. made the ice
to the South, hauled by the wind heading S East
all day along the ice. At 7 P.M. steered off S. I West.
The Brig Hidalgo and Alice Knowles, and one
other Bark in sight.

Wednesday Aug 28th Lat 69.58 N. Long 166.39 W.
Today light breeze from the E. N. East
with fog until 10 A.M. then steered off S West
along the ice. Gammed the Mermaid. The
Alice Knowles and Brig Hidalgo, Andrew Hicks
in sight.

Thursday Aug 29th Lat 69.55 N. Long 168.45 W.
Nearly calm. Later part light
breeze from E. N. East. Steered W by N along the
ice. All the ships in sight.

Friday Aug 30th No Observation.
Fresh breeze from the E. N. East
with rain and fog most of day. Steering to the
westward by skills. Gammed the Alice Knowles
and Andrew Hicks. The other ships in sight.

1895. WEDNESDAY, DECEMBER 11, 1889

Saturday Aug 31st Lat 69.55 N. Long 171.50 W.
Today moderate breeze from NE to
North. Heading N West to W by North. Rain
most of the day. The Andrew Hicks in sight.

Sunday Sept 1st No Observation
Today fresh breeze from the E. N. E.
Steering N. N. West. Overcast weather. The A Hicks
in sight.

Monday Sept 2nd Lat 71.40 N. Long 174.21 W.
Today moderate breeze from the E. E. S. E.
in close to the ice. At 4 P.M. saw two whales
rising. Saw the A Hicks with boat down.

Tuesday Sept 3rd No Observation.
Light baffling winds from the
Eastward. Trying to work to the S East. Herald
Island in sight bearing S W by South. A Hicks in
sight, and the ice. Saw a Bowhead one rising.

Wednesday Sept 4th 71.15 N. Long 172.50 W.
Today strong breeze from the S East.
Ship working to the windward. The ice in sight
and the A Hicks. Herald Island in sight.
