

1895. WEDNESDAY, DECEMBER 18, 1889

Saturday Oct 5th Lat 71.30 N. Long 171.30 W.
Today fresh breeze from N. N. West
Ship on different tacks, along the ice. First
fog until 11.30 A.M., then cleared up. At
11.30 A.M. saw a Bowhead close to the ship.
Lowered two boats, did not see the whale
again. At 5.30 P.M., saw the Alice Knowles
take a whale.

Sunday Oct 6th No Observation.
Today strong breeze from the N. East.
Ship on different tacks along the ice. At
7 A.M. raised a bowhead, lowered four boats
but did not see the whale again. Alice Knowles
and Ste Thrasher in sight. The Thrasher had
boats down.

Monday Oct 7th No Observation.
Today nearly a gale from the N. E.
Ship on different tacks. Ice in sight. Saw
a Bowhead two times, did not lower,
whale going S West. Alice Knowles and Thrasher
in sight.

Tuesday Oct 8th Lat 71.30 Long 172.00 W.
Today nearly a gale same as yesterday
from N. E. Ship on different tacks. Saw a Bowhead
one rising going fast to S West. Saw the Alice
Knowles and Thrasher.

1895. THURSDAY, DECEMBER 19, 1889

Wednesday Oct 9th.
Today strong breeze from N. East.
Ship on different tacks. Saw Alice Knowles.
Snow squalls most of the day.

Thursday Oct 10th.
Today strong breeze from the
North. Ship on different tacks. At 2 P.M.
raised several Bowheads; lowered four boats,
waist boat struck and drained. Snow most
of the day. Saw the Thrasher.

Friday Oct 11th.
Today strong breeze from the
North with snow all day. At 6 A.M. raised a
Bowhead close to the ship. Lowered two boats
but did not see him again. At 1 P.M. steered
off S. East by East.

Saturday Oct 12th.
Today strong breeze from the N.
N. East. Steering E, S. East until 6 P.M., then steered
S. East by South, half South. Snow most of the day.

Sunday Oct 13th Lat 66.51 N. Long 169.18 W.
Today fresh breeze from the N. N. East.
Steering S. East by South $\frac{1}{2}$ South, until 9 A.M., then
steered S. East by East. At 3 P.M. sighted the land
at East Cape bearing South. At 5 P.M. steered off South
by East. At 6 P.M. East Cape bearing South by West distant
