Passage to Cape Horn

Remarks onboard Friday Oct 26th 1855

The fore part fresh breezes and squalls from the S E the middle part the same employed at various jobs the latter part squally with fresh breezes from the S E by E the ship close hauled on the starboard tack heading S by W Lat 28.43 N Long 21.25 W

Remarks onboard Saturday Oct 27th 1855

The fore part strong breezes and rain squalls from the S E the middle part the same employed at various jobs the latter part fresh breezes from the E E steering S Lat 26.10 N Long 31.30 W

Remarks onboard Sunday Oct 28th 1855

The fore part strong breezes and squalls from the E S E saw two sails steering N W or there about the middle and latter part fresh breezes from E by S the ship close hauled on the starboard tack heading S by E Lat 24.15 N Long 30.55 W

Remarks onboard Monday Oct 29th 1855

The fore part fresh breezes from the E the portu- geese on duty again the middle part the same employed setting up rigging the latter part fresh breezes from the E by S steering S by E Lat 21.41 N Long 30.05 W

Remarks onboard Tuesday Oct 30th 1855

The fore part of the day fresh breezes and rain squalls from the E Hunt come on duty again the middle part the same employed setting up rigging the latter part fresh breezes from the E by S steering S by E Lat 20.23 N Long 29.00 W

Remarks onboard Wednesday Oct 31st 1855

The fore part of the day fresh breezes and rain squalls from the E S E the middle much the same employed at various jobs the latter part moderate breezes from the E heading S E Lat 18.26 N Long 28.08 W

Passage to Cape Horn

Remarks onboard Thursday Nov 1st 1855

The fore part moderate breezes from the E by E the middle part the same employed in the rigging the latter part light breezes from the E steering by the wind heading S E saw a shoal of cow fish and two blackfish lowered the boats for them but could not ketch up to them Lat 16.42 N Long 26.50 W

Remarks onboard Friday Nov 2nd 1855

The fore part fresh breezes from the E passed a brig showing Portugee cullers the middle part the same the latter part fresh breezes from the E steering S Lat 15.04 N Long 25.40 W

Remarks onboard Saturday Nov 3rd

The fore part pleasant with moderate breezes from the E by S a sail in sight to leeward the middle part the same employed at various jobs the latter part fresh breezes from the E steering S saw two fin backs Lat 12.46 N Long 24.40 W

Remarks onboard Sunday Nov 4th

The fore part moderate breezes from the E saw a brig steering to the N the middle part cloudy the latter part light baffling winds and rain squalls the course S Lat 10.02 N Long cloudy

Remarks onboard Monday Nov 5th

The fore part of the day fine weather and light breezes from the S E the middle part the same employed at various jobs the latter part very light air from the S E by E the ship close hauled on the starboard tack heading S by W Lat 8.42 N Long 23.58 W

Remarks onboard Tuesday Nov 6th

The fore part light breezes from the E S E the middle part squally employed at various jobs the latter part light air from the S E steering by the wind heading S W Lat 7.30 N Long 23.54 W
