ed brackeing out and cooping provisions Lat 8.04 S
Long 30.00 W

Remarks onbord Tuesday Nov 20th

The fore part of the day fresh breezes from the S
S & E the middle part the same employed cooping
provisions the latter part fresh breezes from the
E the ship steering S 1/2 W Lat 10.46 S Long 29.30 W

Remarks onbord Wednesday Nov 21st

The fore part of the day fresh breezes from the
E S & spoke the mosquito of Liverpool from
Rio Grand the middle and latter part fresh
breezes from the E by S steering S by W
employed cooping provisions Lat 13.39 S
Long 29.26 W

Remarks onbord Thursday Nov 22^d

The fore part of the day light breezes from the
E saw a French barque steering on the wind to
the S & E the middle and latter part light breezes
from the N E steering S by W Lat 16.29 S Long 29.22

Remarks onbord Friday Nov 23^d

The fore part of the day light breezes from the N E
saw a sail beding to the Eastward the middle part
the same employed cooping provisions the latter
part light breezes from the N E by N steering
S S W Lat 18.08 S Long 29.00 W

Remarks onbord Saturday Nov 24th

The fore part of the day light breezes from the N E
the middle part the same employed at various jobs
the latter part light breezes from the E S & E the
Island of Trinmadad in sight bearing S by W at
sun set shortened sail and bore the ship to
Lat 19.48 S Long 29.10 W

Remarks onbord Sunday Nov 25th

The fore part of the day light breezes from the N.
spoke the Eliza Jane of Sisbury three months out clean
at seven o'clock the starboard and waist boats went in
shore fishing the middle part much the same saw a
sail off shore heading in the latter part light breezes
from the N N E the boats come onbord about four
o'clock having caught a good mess of fish we kept off
S by W and so ends this twenty four hours Lat 20.36 S
Long 29.10 W

Remarks onbord Monday Nov 26th

The fore part of the day light breezes from the N
The middle part light breezes from the N W employ
ed at various jobs the latter part fresh breezes from
the S and rain squalls came a small shoal of sperm
whales they had seen the ship and was going quick to
the windward lowered the boats and chased them
untill dark but they were going faster than the boats
could pull they was raised of deck about 1/4 of an mile of
about five o'clock in the afternoon Lat 21.48 S
Long 29.30 W

the middle part the same employed at various jobs
the latter part fresh breezes from the S E the
ship steering S W Lat 23.06 Long 30.12 W

the latter part light breezes from the N E steering
S W saw a sail on our starboard quarter Lat 24.36 S
Long 31.43 W
