The fore part of the day strong breezes from the S
the middle part much the same the latter part
the wind more to the Southward tacked ship and
headed W by S.

Remarks on Board Monday Dec 24th

The fore part of the day fresh breezes from the S by W
saw two sails steering to the S E the middle part much
the same the latter part light baffling winds Staten land
in sight bearing W about thirty five miles distant at sunset

Remarks on Board Tuesday Dec 25th

The fore part of the day light airs from the S W saw
a large ship steering to the Westward the middle part
light baffling winds spoke and gained with the ship
Caroline of New Bedford she was sixty days from the
Sandwich Islands bound home the latter part of
the day light breezes from the S W by S
steering S W by S

Remarks on Board Wednesday Dec 26th

The fore part of the day light breezes from from
the W S W the middle part fresh breezes from the
W and rain squalls the latter part a moderate gale
from the W the ship laying to under main topsail and
foresail heading S S W

The fore part of the day fresh breezes from the
S W by W the middle light baffling winds
the latter part light breezes and rain from
the S W the ship heading W S W

Remarks on Board Friday Dec 28th

The fore part of the day fresh breezes from the S W
ten ships in sight all on the western tack the middle
part much the same the latter part a moderate gale
from the W by S saw the land and tacked ship headi
ng S by W

Remarks on Board Saturday Dec 29th

The fore part of the day fresh breezes from the W by S
saw one homeward bound whaler and five or six other
sails bound to the Westward the middle part much the same
the latter part a moderate gale from the W S W

Remarks on Board Sunday Dec 30th

The fore part of the day a heavy gale from the W
took in the fore and mizen topsails and foresail
split the main topsail and furlled it the ship laying
to under the fore and main spencers and topmast staysail
heading S by W the middle part heavy hail squalls the
latter part more moderate bent another main topsail and
set a double reefed main topsail and fore sail the
ship laying to on the starboard tack heading S S W

Remarks on Board Monday Dec 31st

The fore part of the day a moderate gale from the W
set double reefed topsails the middle part more moderate
set the main sail and jib the latter part strong breezes
from the S W the ship on the port tack heading W S W
