The fore part of the day light breezes from the N S W the middle part a moderate gale from the W S W the latter part fresh breezes from the W the ship on the Port tack heading S S W Board of duty sick

The fore part of the day fresh breezes from the W saw two ships bound to the Eastward the middle part much the same the latter part strong breezes S W at 4 o'clock raised sperm Whales and lowered the boats the starboard boat struck a large whale and soon after the larboard boat struck the same whale and then he started and run to the windward and would show no chance to work at just before sunset the larboard boat drewed and the starboard boat cut and we lost him D Desolation Island in sight bearing N E by E
