Remarks on Board Saturday Jan 12th

The fore part of the day a moderate gale from the S^W the middle part more moderate the latter part strong breezes from the N^W S^W the ship lost hauled on the starboard tack heading S^W No Obs

Remarks on Board Sunday Jan 13th

The fore part of the day strong breezes from the S^W the middle part much the same the latter part fresh breezes from the S^W by steering S^W

Remarks on Board Monday Jan 14th

The fore part of the day strong breezes from the S^W the middle part the same the latter part strong breezes and heavy squalls from the N^W S^W sent down the main topsail and bent another steering S^W

Remarks on Board Tuesday Jan 15th

The fore part of the day strong breezes from the N^W the middle part much the same the latter part strong breezes and rain squalls from the N^W see a ship bound to the N

Remarks on Board Wednesday Jan 16th

The fore part of the day strong breezes from the N^W S^W the middle part fresh breezes from the S^W saw a shoal of Black fish going quick to the windward lowered the boats but did not see them from the boats after lowering the latter part of the day fresh breezes from the S steering S^W

Remarks on Board Thursday Jan 17th

The fore part of the day fresh breezes from the N^W the middle part much the same employed at various jobs the latter part fresh breezes from the N^W steering S^W

Remarks on Board Friday Jan 18th

The fore part of the day fresh breezes from the N^W saw a sail the middle part fresh breezes and fog raised land and come up to it about two o'clock the starboard boat went on shore about fore o'clock one on board and stood off shore at half past six saw a humpback and lowered the boats for him but it come on dark and we lost sight of him

Remarks on Board Saturday Jan 19th

The fore part of the day fresh breezes and rain from the S^W the Island of Mocha to the windward and the main land to the leeward the middle part light baffling winds the latter part much the same trying to work up to Mocha bent the larboard anchor and got it of the bow all ready for letting go so ends this twenty four hours

Remarks on Board Sunday Jan 20th

The fore part of the day fresh breezes from the N^W S^W laying off and on at Mocha getting off potatoes the middle part much the same the latter part equally finished getting off potatoes and stood off shore heading S James Ekler and Robert Aldrich run away or forgot to come on board

Remarks on Board Monday Jan 21th

The fore part of the day light breezes from the S^W E saw a shoal of sperm whales going quick to the windward toward the boats but did not see the whales from the boats after lowering the middle and latter parts fresh breezes the ship working to windward
