The fore part of the day strong breezes from the W by N tacked ship and stood in to the S W the middle part more moderate the latter light breezes from the W by N at dark shortened sail

The fore part of the day light breezes from the E the middle part strong breezes the latter part a fresh gale from the N E the ship laying to on the Starboard Tack

Remarks on Board Tuesday Apr 22nd

The fore part of the day a fresh gale from the N E split the maintopsail and furled it the middle part more moderate set the fore and mizen topsails and bent another main topsail at seven o'clock took in sail and hove too on the Starboard Tack

The fore part of the day strong breezes from the N by E the middle part much the same saw a Finback the latter part strong breezes from the N E steering N W under short sail

The fore part of the day fresh breezes from the N E the middle part the same saw a Right Whale about a mile from the ship heading towards the W called all hands and got the boats ready but did not see any thing more of the whale the latter part of the day fresh breezes from the N E steering N W saw a shoal of Killers

The fore part of the day fresh breezes from the N N E saw two Right Whales going quick towards the N lowered the boats and chased them but did not catch up to them the middle part calm the latter part light breezes from the W by N

The fore part of the day strong breezes from the W by N the middle part much the same the latter part fresh breezes from the W by N the ship close hauled on the Port Tack

Remarks on Board Sunday Apr 27th

The fore part of the day fresh breezes from the W by N saw a number of Finbacks and a shoal of Grampasses about nine o'clock raised ice lowered the boats and went in along the edge of it looking for Whales but did not see any the middle and latter part light airs from the W steering E by N

Remarks on Board Monday Apr 28th

The fore part of the day calm and cold the middle part light breezes from the N E the ship working to the windward to clear the ice which extends as far as we can see to the N the latter part fresh breezes from E S E

The fore part of the day fresh breezes from the E and ~~strong~~ snow the middle part a thick snow storm the latter part strong breezes from the N E and thick wet weather the ship close hauled on the Starboard Tack

The fore part of the day strong breezes from the N the land in sight we stood in for Cape Heronotsky untill we came to the ice which was about fifteen miles of shore we then tacked and stood off shore the middle part fresh breezes from the N E the latter part light breezes from the N E saw a number of Finbacks the ship close hauled on the Port Tack
