The fore part of the day strong breezes from the E and a thick rain storm the middle part more moderate and thick fog the latter part fresh breezes from the S E the ship close hauled heading E S E

Remarks on Board Tuesday June 24th
The fore part of the day fresh breezes from the S E saw a sulphur bottom the middle part saw a number of Muscidigera and lowered the boats for them without success the latter part saw St Pauls Islands the Starboard and Waist boats went in shore and shot a mess of ducks and saw one Bow head about six o'clock it set in thick fog

Remarks on Board Wednesday June 25th
The fore part of the day fresh breezes from the S E saw a large number of Finbacks the middle and latter parts thick fog and light breezes from the S E the ship close hauled heading E

Remarks on Board Thursday June 26th
The fore part of the day light breezes from the S E about three o'clock A.M. saw two Right Whales a cow and calf lowered the boats and the Starboard boat struck the calf with the second iron and drewed the middle and latter parts light breezes and fog squalls from the S E saw a number of Finbacks the ship close hauled heading S W

Remarks on Board Friday 27th
The fore part of the day fresh breezes from the E S E and thick rainy weather steering S E by S about ten o'clock luffed too and hauled aback the latter part amoderate gale from the N the ship laying too on the Starboard tack heading W by N

Remarks on Board Saturday June 28th
The fore part of the day fresh breezes from the S the middle part the same the latter part saw a Humpback and lowered for him without success spoke and gamed with the Bark Baltic of Rev Bedford she has seen three whales and caught two steering by the wind on the Port Tack heading W S W

Remarks on Board Sunday June 29th
The fore part of the day fresh breezes from the S and wet rainy weather saw a number of Finbacks the middle part the same the latter part fresh breezes and rain from the S W the ship by the wind on opposite Tacks

Remarks on Board Monday June 30th
The fore part of the day calm and fog squalls the middle part much the same the latter part light breezes from the S S E steering S saw a number of Humpbacks and Finbacks and a great many fur seal
Lat 56.00 N
Long 168.50 W

Remarks on Board Tuesday July 1st
The fore part of the day fresh breezes from the S W the middle part much the same saw a number of Finbacks the latter part strong breezes from the S W the land in sight towards the S E saw an American steamer bound to the N.

Remarks on Board Wednesday July 2nd
The fore part of the day fresh breezes from the S S W at daylight kept off S E the middle and latter parts much the same about half past seven raised humpbacks and lowered the Waist boat without success shortened sail and luffed to
