The fore part of the day strong breezes from the W N W the land in sight to the E saw a number of Humpbacks lowered the boats and the Starboard boat struck but lost the whale the middle and latter parts more moderate the ship lost halled on the Port tack heading N passed several pieces of fatcan

The fore part of the day light breezes from the S N W saw a number of Humpbacks the middle part much the same the latter part light breezes and thick fog from the N W the ship lost halled on the Port tack heading N N E

The fore part of the day light breezes and fog squalls from the W the middle and latter parts much the same saw two Walrus just before sunset saw land in the S S E the ship lost halled on the Port tack heading N N W

The fore part of the day fine pleasant weather with light breezes from the W N W the middle part the same the latter part light breezes from the S W and thick fog the ship lost halled on the Port tack heading W N W

The fore part of the day fresh breezes and thick fog from the W N W the middle part the ~~same~~ fog let up and we lowered the boats for Humpbacks the Starboard boat struck and drewed the latter part fresh breezes and rain from the W the ship lost halled heading S S W

These twentyfour hours strong breezes and squalls of rain and snow from the W N W saw a number of Finbacks and Humpbacks the ship steering S S W

The fore part of the day strong breezes from the W N W the middle part much the same the latter part light breezes from the N W saw a number of Finbacks spoke and gained with the ship Petrel she has picked up a small right whale supposed to be the calf that we struck and shot the 26th of June

Remarks on Board Friday July 11th

The fore part of the day light breezes from the W saw a number of Finbacks the middle and latter parts light breezes from the N W Gaming with the Petrel about nine o'clock P.M. the Petrel raised two right whales and we lowered from both ships without success

Remarks on Board Saturday July 12th

The fore part of the day fresh breezes from the S S E the Petrel in sight to the windward whaling the middle part much the same saw two whales that we called right whales but we could not tell certain as they was some ways off and we only see them once the latter part light airs S spoke the Goodreturn and Braganza the Braganza has got nothing this season the Goodreturn has got two whales
