The fore part of the day strong breezes and rain squalls from the W. stood close in to the land on the land on the N. shore of Bristol Bay the middle and latter parts the same spoke the ship Montauk of Sag Harbor two whales this sea

The fore part of the day strong breezes from the S.W. and dark cloudy weather the middle part rain squalls the latter part strong breezes and thick fog the ship close hauled on opposite tacks

The fore part of the day light breezes from the S.W. saw a right whale going quick to the E. lowered the boats and chased without success the middle and latter parts strong breezes from the W. saw one or two whales going quick to windward spoke the Bark Baltic of N.B. with six whales

The fore part of the day strong breezes from the S.W. and rain squalls saw two R. whales and lowered the boats for them without success the middle and latter parts a moderate gale from the S.W. the ship laying too on the starboard tack heading S.W.

Remarks on Board Tuesday Aug 19th
The fore part of the day light breezes from the W. saw a whale and lowered the boats the starboard boat struck and the iron broke a new gig iron and we lost the whale the middle part light breezes from the S.W. a number of ships in sight the latter part strong breezes from the S.E. saw a number of whales and lowered the boats without success we picked up a small sized cask marked B. A. Brewer with a long piece of towline fast to it I have not found out how much line there is but it is a long piece

Remarks on Board Wednesday Aug 20th
The fore part of the day a moderate gale from the E. the middle part the same I overhauled and dived that line we picked up yesterday there is some eight hundred or a thousand fathoms of it as near as I can guess at it there is some of it badly chafed the latter part a moderate gale and wet rainy weather from the S.E. the ship laying too on the Port tack

Remarks on Board Thursday Aug 21th
The fore part of the day strong breezes from the S.W. and thick wet weather the middle and latter parts light airs and fog from the S.E. gamed with the ship Japan she has got four whales and a half the ship laying aback on the starboard tack

The fore part of the day strong breezes from the S.E. and thick wet weather we picked up a large whale that had been badly eaten by killers the middle and latter parts strong breezes and rain from the S.E. cut our whale and lay too all night on the Port tack
