jobs just after sunset saw a shoal of Blackfish
going quick to the N. W. steering S. S. E.

Remarks on Board Thursday Oct 30th
The fore part of the day calm the middle part the
same the watch employed at various jobs saw two
or three Grampasses the latter part light breezes from
the N. the ship close hauled on the Port tack

Remarks on Board Friday Oct 31st

The fore part of the day light breezes from the
N. N. W. Cape St Lucas in sight about fifty miles
distant a Brig in sight steering to the E. ward
about eight o'clock A. M. raised a shoal of small
sperm whales covered the boats and the Larboard
boat struck one and took him to the ship cut
him in and stood in shore saw one Humpback
and one Finback and a shoal of cow fish the
latter part of the day light breezes from the
N. W. the ship by the wind on opposite tacks

Remarks on Board Saturday Nov 1st
The fore part of the day fresh breezes from the N. N. W.
W. saw a shoal of Black fish and lowered for them
without success the middle and latter parts strong
breezes from the N. W. just after dinner the Capt. went
on shore and got a Bullock and a few sweet potatoes and
two boats loads of wood at dark came on Board
and kept off S. S. E. boiling our whale

At Cape St Lucas

Remarks on Board Sunday Nov 2nd

The fore part of the day fresh breezes from the N. N. W.
W. cooled down and cleared up the decks the middle
and latter parts light breezes from the N. N. W. saw
a sulphur bottom a shoal of Porpoises and a swordfish
steering S. S. E.

Remarks on Board Monday Nov 3rd
All this twentyfour hours fresh breezes from the N. N. W.
E. the watch employed at various jobs coopered and stowed
down our whale 16 blbs just before dark raised a sail
two points on the lee bow. steering S. E. Lat 19.30 N
Long 109.40 W

Remarks on Board Tuesday Nov 4th

The fore part of the day fresh breezes from the N. N. W.
E. the watch employed at various jobs saw a
large shoal of Confish the middle and latter parts
the same caught a Turtle steering S. E. by E.
