Remarks on Board Tuesday Dec 9th

The fore part of the day light airs from the N^W the middle part light airs from the W^W bent the cables and got the anchors off the bow saw several sail the latter part light breezes from the S^W the ship close in shore heading off to the W^W ward
Sat 3, 26 25

Remarks on Board Wednesday Dec 10th

The fore part of the day calm the middle and latter parts light breezes from the N^W about seven o'clock P.M. came to an anchor off Tombey in 5 fathoms water

Remarks on Board Thursday Dec 11th

All this twentyfour hours (fresh) fine weather took our anchor and moved in shore and got of a draft of water (4) cask holding about 170 bbls) and washed the ship

Remarks on Board Friday Dec 12

All this twentyfour hours fine weather stowed down our water and painted the bends on one side brook out slops &c

Remarks on Board Saturday Dec 13th

The fore part of the day rainy the larboard watch went on shore on liberty for three days the starboard watch finished painting the bends

Remarks on Board Sunday Dec 14th

All this twentyfour hours fine weather took onboard 49 1/2 bbls potatoes about noon The Bark Leonidas come in to an anchor she is three days from Paita with the small Port onboard

Remarks on Board Monday Dec 15th

All this twentyfour hours fine weather the starboard watch getting off wood at night a small part of the Port watch come on board there is eight men missing including the carpenter one boatsteward and the cook

Remarks on Board Tuesday Dec 16th

All this twentyfour hours fine weather dried and bundled our bone Paul Pangborn and W^m Potter come on Board

Remarks on Board Wednesday Dec 17

All this twentyfour hours fine weather put our bone on board The Bark Arab of fair haven to go home home there is 52 bundles weighing 6329 lbs sent the starboard watch on shore for three days liberty

Remarks on Board Thursday Dec 18th

All this twentyfour hours fine pleasant weather what men there is on board employed getting off wood and stowing it away

Remarks on Board Friday Dec 19th

All this twentyfour hours fine pleasant weather the port watch employed getting off wood at night the starboard watch come onboard The Cook and Robert Anderson brought onboard from the callaboose where they had been confined by the Police for deserting

Remarks on Board Saturday Dec 20th

All this twentyfour hours fine pleasant weather employed getting off wood and stowing of the hatchway
