Remarks on Board Sunday Dec 21st
All this Twentyfour hours fine pleasant weather

Remarks on Board Monday Dec 22nd
All this Twentyfour hours fine pleasant weather took
onboard 50 bbls potatoes and 20 cord of wood sent onshore
21 bbls of Blackfish oil and 5th bbls slush just before
sunset The Capt. came onboard we hoisted short and made
sail the tide was ahead and the wind so light that
we did not start Mr Hiloy came onboard as a fourth
officer

Remarks on Board Tuesday Dec 23rd

The fore part of the day light breezes from the N
about nine o'clock A. M. got underway and worked
off shore the latter part fresh breezes from the N E
the by the wind on the Port tack The Island of St Clair
bearing S E by E 8 miles distant at sunset

Remarks on Board Wednesday Dec 24th
The fore part of the day fresh breezes from the N
tacked ship and stood to the S the middle and
latter parts much the same the watch employed break
ing out at dark halled aback the main topsail

Remarks on Board Thursday Dec 25th

The fore part of the day light airs from the N
the middle part fresh breezes from the N E the
watch employed at various jobs the ship running
down along the land about three o'clock P. M. came
to an anchor off Jumbes The Capt. went onshore and
brought off Thomas Kinds the Carpenter and James
Randal James Woods and John Dobby seaman they
deserted while on liberty ten or twelve days ago
They were taken since we left here day before yesterday
and confined in the stocks where the Capt took them
from we sent on shore 5 bbls Blackfish oil about 5 P. M.
got underway and stood out to sea with a fresh
breeze from the S W

on a Whaling Voyage in the Pacific in 1856

Remarks on Board Friday Dec 26th
All this Twentyfour hours fresh breezes from the S
saw a great many Finbacks and saw one shoal of
Blackfish going quick to the leeward we did not
stop saw another shoal and lowered and caught
two steering W
Lat 25° 6' S
Long 82° 10' W

Remarks on Board Saturday Dec 27th
The fore part of the day fresh breezes from the S by W
the middle part the same the watch employed stowing the
ground tier in the after hold the latter part light breeze
from the S S W steering W
Lat 2° 06' S

Remarks on Board Sunday Dec 28th

All this twentyfour hours light breezes from the
S saw a sail to the windward saw a shoal of
Blackfish going quick to the leeward the ship close
halled on the Port Tack
Lat 1° 56' S
Long 86° 50' W

Remarks on Board Monday Dec 29th
All this twentyfour hours light airs from the S S E spoke
and gamed with the Bark Atlantic about noon she raised
a shoal of sperm whales going very quick to the N we
lowered for them but they soon went out of sight just
at sunset spoke the Bark Statira of N. Bedford
Lat 1° 50' S

Remarks on Board Tuesday Dec 30th

All this twentyfour hours moderate breezes from the
S and S E the watch employed stowing the ground
tier in the after hold saw a sail to the leeward
at dark Woods Island in sight bearing N W about
15 miles distant the ship by the wind on the Starboard
Tack

Remarks on Board Wednesday Dec 31st
All this twentyfour hours fresh breezes from the S S E
Woods Island in sight in the morning saw two sails
to the windward the watch employed at various jobs
at dark took in sail and set quarter watches
Lat 12° 08' S
Long 88° 18' W
