Remarks on Board Thursday Jan 1st
The fore part of the day fresh breezes from the S E
the middle part the same the watch employed at
various jobs the latter part light breezes from the S
S E the ship elist halled on the Port tack
Lat 1.06 S

Remarks on Board Friday Jan 2nd
The fore part of the day fresh breezes from the S E
the watch employed at various jobs the middle and
latter parts the same spoke and gained with the Bark
Atlantic
Lat 1.35 S
Long 88.42 W

Remarks on Board Saturday Jan 3rd

The fore part of the day fresh breezes from the S
S E Hoods Island in sight Bearing W the Atlantic
in sight about ten o'clock raised whales and lowered
for them the Starboard and Bow Boats struck
and saved two small whales got them to the
ship about four o'clock P.M. hooked on and
cut them in before dark then made sail and
stood off shore to the Eastward another sail in
sight to the windward

Remarks on Board Sunday Jan 4th

The fore part of the day light breezes from the
S S E Hoods Island in sight bearing W
about six miles distant tacked ship and stood
off shore we cleared away the whales heads
and started the works the middle and
latter parts light breezes from the S S
E about half past two P.M. raised sperm
whales lowered for them the Starboard
boat struck and saved one got him along
side about dark made all sail and stood
off shore with the whale in Tow Chatham Is
land in sight at a distance bearing N

on a Whaling Voyage in the Pacific in 1857

Remarks on Board Monday Jan 5th
All this twentyfour hours light breezes from the S
S E at daylight hooked on and cut the whale and
started the works again Chatham Island in sight
bearing W S W the ship elist halled working to
the windward

Remarks on Board Tuesday Jan 6th
All this twentyfour hours light breezes from the S
Chatham Island and Hoods Island both in sight the
ship working to the windward
No Obs

Remarks on Board Wednesday Jan 7th

The fore part of the day light baffling winds finished
boiling and cooled down the middle part calm the
latter part fresh breezes from the S S E Hoods
Island about five miles off to the S W
No Obs

Remarks on Board Thursday Jan 8th
All this twentyfour hours fresh breezes from the S E
and S S E the watch employed at various jobs
Charles Island in sight bearing N W by S
the ship elist halled on the Starboard tack
No Obs

Remarks on Board Friday Jan 9th

All this twentyfour hours light airs from the
S E all hands employed breaking out and stowing
down the oil saw a shoal of Grampasses the ship
by the wind on the Starboard tack
Lat 1.50 S

Remarks on Board Saturday Jan 10th
All this twentyfour hours light breezes from the
S the land in sight saw a sail in shore
finished stowing down about one o'clock raised white
water supposed it to be sperm whales but did
not see it after the ship by the wind on the Star
board tack
