Remarks on Board Saturday May 16th

The fore part of the day light breezes from the N^W the middle part calm saw several Humpbacks and Finbacks and large quantities of Killers and Grampasses the Starboard boat lowered for Killers without success the latter part fresh breezes from the N^W the ship by the wind on the Port Tack

Remarks on Board Sunday May 17th

The fore part of the day light breezes and fog squalls from the N^W the middle part clear fine weather saw a number of Finbacks and one or two Humpbacks the latter part fresh breezes and thick fog from the N^W steering N^W

Remarks on Board Monday May 18th

The fore part of the day light breezes from the N^W and thick fog and rain about two o'clock P.M. the fog lit up a number of Finbacks in sight the latter part light airs from the N^W the ship by the wind on the Starboard Tack

All this twenty-four hours light baffling winds and calms saw one or two Finbacks and a shoal of Grampasses the ship working towards the N^W

The fore part of the day fresh breezes and rain from the E at daylight made all sail and left off N^W at eight o'clock A.M. it breezed on we took the light sails at nine we double reefed the Topsails the wind halling more to the N at ten we took in the mainsail jib and foretopsail at eleven we wore ship took in the foresail and mizen topsail blowing a gale from the N^W about three P.M. took in the main Topsail blowing very heavy about midnight it began to moderate set the main Topsail

The fore part of the day moderate breeze and thick fog the middle part calm and foggy the latter part a light breeze from the N just before sunset the fog lit up we saw a number of Finbacks land in sight at a distance bearing N^W

The fore part of the day calm and thick fog the middle part calm the fog lit up saw a number of Finbacks one or two Humpbacks and a shoal of Grampasses the latter part light breezes from the N^W by E the ship by the wind on the Port Tack land in sight in the N^W
