Remarks on Board Monday June 1st

All this twentyfour hours fresh breezes from the S E and S S E and snow and hail squalls saw two Finbacks and a shoal of Killers. steered E S E

Remarks on Board Tuesday June 2nd

The fore part of the day fresh breezes from the E and a thick wet snow storm the middle and latter parts light breezes from the E S E saw a number of Finbacks the ship working to the N E

Remarks on Board Wednesday June 3rd

The fore part of the day fresh breezes from the S E the middle part the same saw a number of Finbacks the latter part strong breezes from the S steered S E by S untill dark then shortened sail and luffed to on the starboard tack thick wet weather

Remarks on Board Thursday June 4th

The fore part of the day light breezes from the W and thick fog the middle and latter parts light breezes from the S W steering S under all sail saw two or three Finbacks

Remarks on Board Friday June 5th

The fore part of the day fresh breezes from the N E steered S untill noon then halled up W S W saw several Finbacks the middle and latter parts fresh breezes from the N N E steering W S W under all sail
Lat 45.16 N
Long 158.08 E

Remarks on Board Saturday June 6th

All this twentyfour hours light breezes from the N S W and fine pleasant weather the ship working to the Westward saw one Humpback
Lat 44.03 N
Long 156.00 E

Remarks on Board Sunday June 7th

The fore part of the day light airs from the E sent the main topsail down and mended it the middle and latter parts fresh breezes from the N E and cloudy wet weather steering W S W

Remarks on Board Monday June 8th

The fore part of the day strong breezes from the N S E took in the light sails the middle part strong breezes and fog the latter part light S baffling winds and calms the ship working to the N W

Remarks on Board Tuesday June 9th

All this twentyfour hours light baffling winds and calms working through trees attracts sounded several times but found no bottom at 80 fathoms the latter part of the day thick fog passed a very heavy tide rip

The fore part of the day thick fog and calm the middle part much the same heard a whale spouting and lowered the starboard boat to see what it was but did not see him the latter part light breezes from the E S E steering N
