Remarks on Board Wednesday July 8th
The fore part of the day calm the Waist boat and Starboard boat (and starboard) went round in Taylors bay the starboard boat struck a whale and towed him in shore and anchored him on the beach

Remarks on Board Thursday July 9th
All this twentyfour hours fresh breezes the Starboard and bow boats went to the ship the Starboard boat struck a whale and lost a line in the ice then went to the ship after another then went back the underway coming round in Taylors bay after the whale

Remarks on Board Friday July 10th
All this twentyfour hours light baffling winds and calms the boats off looking for whales but did not see any the ship got round and came to an anchor in Taylors bay the whale on the beach

Remarks on Board Saturday July 11th
All this twentyfour hours light baffling winds and calms got the whale off the beach and towed him to the ship cut him and started the works got the ship underway and worked out of the bay

Remarks on Board Sunday July 12th
The fore part of the day light breezes from the S.W. finished coiling the Starboard and Waist boats went off through the ice across the bay looking for the whales spoke the ship Caroline of N.B. with two whales the latter part of the day fresh breezes and thunder squalls from the S.E. the ship working across the bay through thin scattering ice

Remarks on Board Monday July 13th
The fore part of the day light breezes from the S.W. saw whales lowered the Starboard and Bow boats the captain and shipkeepers stowing down the middle part calm the latter part light breezes from the S.W. the Starboard and bow boats came on board the ship came to anchor in the S.E. part of Mercury bay

Remarks on Board Tuesday July 14th
All this twentyfour hours light baffling winds and calms lowered the Starboard and Bow boats and went up the bay looking for whales about noon the Starboard boat came on board and reported plenty of whales in Potters bay had got two killed and made fast to the beach then went back to try and get another one at night the Starboard and Bow boats came on board and got supper then the Starboard boat started for Potters bay and the bow boat stayed to help get the ship in there

Remarks on Board Wednesday July 15th
All this twentyfour hours light baffling winds and calms the Starboard boat struck and saved a small whale the Waist boat laying by a whale that had sank the Starboard and Bow boats fishing for more whales took two to the ship and cut them in then the Starboard boat went after one that was on the beach cleared it decks a little and all hands went below except two or three
