

The Ship Callac A. B. Howland Master on a whaling voyage in the Pacific in 1857
Ochotsk Sea

Remarks on Board Thursday July 16th.
All this twentyfour hours light winds and calms
got one whale off the beach and cut him in three
sent the Bow boat after the other whale that
was on the beach and the Starboard and
~~Bow~~ Waist boat to try and catch another but
without success whales growing scarce started
the works and commenced boiling.

Remarks on Board Friday July 17th.
All this twentyfour hours and changeable strong
breezes and calms two boats off looking for whales
but without success the whales have left the bay
the Starboard and Waist boats came on board with
about two boats load of blocks and rigging picked
up on the beach supposed to have belonged to
the ship ~~Slater~~ of N. B. spoke the Bark Black
Eagle of Sag Harbor with two whales.

Remarks on Board Saturday July 18th.
All this twentyfour hours changeable the Starboard
and Bow boats up the bay looking for whales they
came on board in the afternoon had ^{four} but ^{one} fin' whales
and then why James Eckler and Henry J. Jewell
deserted from the Starboard boat and Robert Aldrich
from the Bow boat the Captain took the Starboard
boat and went after them himself.

Remarks on Board Sunday July 19th.
All this twentyfour hours light baffling winds and calms the
Starboard boat came on board and brought James Eckler the
captain and one man on shore finished boiling and cooled
down.

Remarks on Board Monday July 20th.
All this twentyfour hours light baffling winds and calms
employed stowing down the Captain came on board with the
Starboard boat and brought back Robert ~~Aldrich~~ ^{Jewell} and
Henry Jewell seized Robert Aldrich in the rigging and
flogged him this is the third time he has deserted.

Remarks on Board Tuesday July 21st.
The fore part of the day thick fog employed scraping
up and washing down the middle and latter parts
light airs from the N. N. E. got the ship underway and
stood out of Pithers bay.

Remarks on Board Wednesday July 22nd.
The fore part of the day light airs from the S. E. the
Starboard and Bow boats started to go round the N. E.
headland the ship underway working in the same
direction the middle and latter parts thick fog the
ship came to anchor again.

Remarks on Board Thursday July 23rd.
All this twentyfour hours light baffling winds
and calms the most part of the day thick fog the
Starboard and Waist boats went in shore looking
for whales without success at night came on board
the other two boats cruising along shore to the
E.
