Remarks on Board Friday July 24<sup>th</sup>  
All this twentyfour hours light baffling winds and calms the most part of the day thick fog and rain went down the foretopgalant yard and mast the Starboard and bow boats started to come on board but could not get to the ship

Remarks on Board Saturday July 25<sup>th</sup>  
All this twentyfour hours squally thick fog and rain the Starboard and bow boats looking for the ship but could not find her found the ship Josephine and went on board of her for the night

Remarks on Board Sunday July 26<sup>th</sup>  
All this twentyfour hours light baffling winds and calms and a light thin fog the Starboard and Whist boats cleared away and went in shore and the Starboard and bow boats got on board again then we fired for the other two boats they come on board and we took the anchor and got underway and worked to the S.W. untill about midnight then come to an anchor again it being thick fog and calm

Remarks on Board Monday July 27<sup>th</sup>  
All this twentyfour hours light baffling winds and calms and a thick fog the ship laying to an anchor put some bolts and plates in our rudder to strengthen the fishing

Remarks on Board Tuesday July 28<sup>th</sup>  
All this twentyfour hours light baffling winds got the ship under way and stood in towards the bay cleared away the boats and went in shore looking for whales at night come to an anchor

Remarks on Board Wednesday July 29<sup>th</sup>  
All this twentyfour hours light baffling winds and calms got underway and went over towards Potters bay and come to again the boats in shore chasing whales

Remarks on Board Thursday July 31<sup>st</sup>  
All this twentyfour hours light baffling winds the boats all in shore after whales the whales very wild could not strike them

Remarks on Board Friday July 31<sup>st</sup>  
All this twentyfour hours light baffling winds the boats in shore after whales the officer Frazer brought us our boat anchor and iron that we lost with a whale the fore part of the month she picked him up in the ice about twenty miles from where we anchored him the ice must have come in ahead of him and taken him off

Remarks on Board Saturday Aug 1<sup>st</sup>  
All this twentyfour hours light baffling winds and calms the boats in shore after whales

Remarks on Board Sunday Aug 2<sup>d</sup>  
All this twentyfour hours light baffling winds and calms the boats in shore after whales but without success at night all hands come on board the first time we have all been on board for a week
