Whales 70 646

Remarks on Board Monday Aug 10th

All this twentyfour hours light baffling winds three boats off cruising for whales about nine o'clock a.m. our sunken whale came up close to the ship took him along side and cut him in a number of ships in sight and no whales

Remarks on Board Tuesday Aug 11th

All this twentyfour hours light breezes and calms got underway and worked to the Eastward two boats in shore commenced boiling one whale

Remarks on Board Wednesday Aug 12th

The fore part of the day thick fog and calm come to an anchor the middle part the fog lit up and we got underway again the latter part light breezes from the E the ship working along the land to the E finished boiling

Remarks on Board Thursday Aug 13th

The fore part of the day fresh breezes from the S and thick hazy weather the middle part calm all hands stowing down the latter part fresh breezes from the S W by S the ship by the wind working to the S

Remarks on Board Friday Aug 14th

This twentyfour hours very changeable most all kinds of weather but clear saw large quantities of mustlediger whales lowered for them without success at dark shortened sail the ship by the wind working to the S the wind variable

on a whaling voyage in the Pacific in 1857

Remarks on Board Saturday Aug 15th

The fore part of the day strong breezes from the S and thick wet weather saw plenty of mustledigers and lowered for them but without success the middle and latter parts strong breezes from the S W by W and thick wet weather saw the land to the W

Remarks on Board Sunday Aug 16th

The fore part of the day fresh breezes from the S W by W and thick wet weather kept off E by S about noon raised a sail and run for her about three o'clock she clewed down and commenced cutting soon after we raised a whale and lowered for him but without success saw a Bark to the leeward whaling

Remarks on Board Monday Aug 17th

All this twentyfour hours light baffling winds and calms laying off the Saghalien gulf two boats in shore looking for whales saw one going in towards the gulf quick at night came on board the ship working down the gulf spoke the ship *Thyren Queen* of Fairhaven and the Bark *Kingfisher* of N.B. the *Thyren Queen* had been a shore on a sand back

Remarks on Board Tuesday Aug 18th

The fore part of the day to calm come to an anchor lowered three boats and went up the bay looking for whales saw one the middle part thick fog the latter part fresh breezes from the S W by W got underway the boats all on board
