Whales 120 blks

Remarks on Board Wednesday Aug 19th

The fore part of the day light breezes from the N and NNE steering in to the gulf about noon raised whales and lowered the boats the Waist boat struck and saved a large whale the latter part of the day strong breezes from the NNE got the whale to the ship and came to an anchor and cut him a very bad sea running

Remarks on Board Thursday Aug 20th

The fore part of the day strong breezes from the NNE saw whales and lowered two boats for them started the works the middle and latter parts light breezes and calms three boats off chasing whales but without success

Remarks on Board Friday Aug 21st

All this twentyfour hours light breezes and fine pleasant weather saw whales and lowered for them the Waist boat struck and the iron break and she lost the whale got the ship underway

Remarks on Board Saturday Aug 22nd

All this twentyfour hours strong breezes and squalls saw whales and lowered for them but without success finished boiling and commenced to stow down

Remarks on Board Sunday Aug 23rd

The fore part of the day calm finished stowing down and spoke the Ship Josephine the middle and latter parts strong breezes from the N and NNE the ship by the wind working out of the gulf

Remarks on Board Monday Aug 24th

The fore part of the day strong breezes from NNE split the Tib and sent it in and bent a new one the middle part more moderate saw a number of mustelidgers the latter part of the day light breezes from the NNE the ship working to windward

Remarks on Board Tuesday Aug 25th

All this twentyfour hours moderate breezes from the NNE spoke and gained with the Ship Lexington of Nantucket the ship working to the Westward towards Mercury bay saw a shoal of Killers

Remarks on Board Wednesday Aug 26th

All this twentyfour hours fresh breezes from the NNE got in to Mercury bay and spoke the Ship Simor of Sagharbo worked in shore

Remarks on Board Thursday Aug 27th

The fore part of the day light breezes from the NNE stood in shore and came to anchor under the N shore of Mercury bay two boats in shore after noon the middle and latter parts much the same

Remarks on Board Friday Aug 28th

The fore part of the day light breezes from the NNE got off a raft of water the middle and latter parts strong breezes from the NNE two boats getting off wood got one or two spars there is twelve or thirteen ships at anchor within a mile of us got seven blks Pork from the Bark Warren of N.B.
