Remarks on Board Friday Sep 25th
The fore part of the day a moderate gale from the S.W. the middle part the same the latter part more moderate saw whales and lowered two boats but without success the ship by the wind under short sail

Remarks on Board Saturday Sep 26th
All this twentyfour hours light baffling winds and calms saw a number of Finbacks and one or two right whales lowered the boats but without success saw land to the E

Remarks on Board Sunday Sep 27th
The fore part of the day light airs from the E & S.W. and gamed with the ship Ontario saw a number of Finbacks the latter part light breezes from the W. the ship by the wind on the Port tack under all sail

Remarks on Board Monday Sep 28th
All this twentyfour hours strong breezes from the W. and N.W. saw three or four whales and lowered for them but without success a sail in sight to the S. the ship by the wind under short sail

Remarks on Board Tuesday Sep 29th
All this twentyfour hours light airs from the N.E. saw said whales and lowered for them but without success Aoid Island in sight and another Island to the E or E.N.E. from Aoid Island three ships in sight one of them got a whale the ship by the wind at dark shortened sail

Remarks on Board Wednesday Sep 30th
All this twentyfour hours light airs from the N. and N.W. saw whales and lowered for them the Starboard boat got near enough to dart at a whale and got slightly fast just as he was getting out of the way she held on a few moments and drained spoke the Florida and the Maringo let the Maringo have three cask of water

Remarks on Board Thursday Oct 1st
All this twentyfour hours fresh breezes from the S.W. saw whales and lowered for them the Whist boat struck and got capsized by a foul line when she struck the whale kicked the bowsprit over the head of the boat then started off quick and over she went the land in sight and five ships

Remarks on Board Friday Oct 2nd
The fore part of the day a moderate gale from the S.S.W. and thick wet weather the middle and latter parts more moderate the wind halled to the N.W. and cleared it set the Topsails bent a new fore topsail the ship by the wind on the Port tack

The fore part of the day a light air from the N.W. the middle and latter parts calm a very heavy swell running from the N.W. land in sight to the E and N.E. by N. Aoid Island bearing S 1/2 E the ship trying to work to the W. under all sail
