The fore part of the day light airs from the W^W
the middle part calm the watch employed at various
jobs saw a number of finbacks the latter part
fresh breezes from the S steering E under all sail

Remarks on Board Wednesday Oct 14th
All this twentyfour hours strong breezes from the
S and S W carried away the fly jib boom and
made another and sent it out steering E by N
under topsails and courses

Remarks on Board Thursday Oct 15th
The fore part of the day light breezes and rain squalls
from the S W the middle part light breezes
from the W the watch employed washing the spars
the latter part fresh breezes from the W S W steer-
ing E by N under all sail

Remarks on Board Friday Oct 16th
All this twentyfour hours strong breezes and squalls
from the W and W S W the watch employed
washing ship steering S E by E under all sail
Lat 41.40 N

Remarks on Board Saturday Oct 17th
All this twentyfour hours light breezes and
rain squalls from the W S W steering S E by
E under all sail the watch employed washing
the spars

Remarks on Board Sunday Oct 18th
All this twentyfour hours light breezes from the S
W and fine pleasant weather steering S E under
all sail

Remarks on Board Monday Oct 19th
All this twentyfour hours moderate breezes from the
S S W all hands employed washing bone and paint-
ing some of the spars steering S E by E under all
sail

Remarks on Board Tuesday Oct 20th
All this twentyfour hours light breezes from the S
and S S W all hands employed washing bone and
sending up the fore topgalant mast and yard bent a
new main topgalant sail steering by the wind on the
starboard tack

All this twentyfour hours light breezes from the S
the watch employed at various jobs the ship by the
wind working to the S under all sail

S saw a ship to the windward the watch
employed washing ship the ship working to the
southward under all sail
