Remarks on Board Monday Nov 2^d.
All this twentyfour hours fresh breezes from the E
by S the watch employed scraping the stantions
and varnishing them steering S S W under all sail

Lat 23.26 N
Long 151.20 W

Remarks on Board Tuesday Nov 3^d.
All this twentyfour hours fresh breezes from the E carry-
ed away a topmast standing sail bore the watch employed
at various jobs at dark took in the light sails steering
S S W

Lat 20.46 N
Long 153.32 W

Remarks on Board Wednesday Nov 4th

All this twentyfour hours strong breezes from
the E S E about one P.M. raised the land run
run down along the land to the W at daylight
found ourselves to the leeward of the Port brace
d up and worked back to the Windward again

Remarks on Board Thursday Nov 5th.
All this twentyfour hours light breezes from the E
S E about seven o'clock A.M. got a Pilot and went in
and came to an Anchor in Hilo harbor about one o'clock
P.M. scrubbed the decks and got a staff of cask ready to
get water

Remarks on Board Friday Nov 6th

All this twentyfour hours fine pleasant weather
got off a raft of water and our provisions from the
storehouse

on a whaling voyage in the Pacific in 1857
In port Hilo

Remarks on Board Saturday Nov 7th.
All this twentyfour hours fine pleasant weather the Port
watch on Liberty the starboard watch employed at vary-
ous jobs took on board 35 bundles of bone from the ship
Empire got off a seventeen hundred pound anchor from
the shore

Remarks on Board Sunday Nov 8th.
All this twentyfour hours wet rainy weather All hands
ashore on Liberty except one boats crew

Remarks on Board Monday Nov 9th.
All this twentyfour hours wet rainy weather the
starboard watch ashore on Liberty the Port watch
employed at various jobs

Remarks on Board Tuesday Nov 10th.
All this twentyfour hours changeable unsteady weather
the port watch on Liberty the starboard watch got off
a raft of water and 25 bbls of Potatoes and blacked
the legends on the Port side Discharged the third Mate
and four Kanakas

Remarks on Board Wednesday Nov 11th

All this twentyfour hours light breezes from the
S E all ^{hands} employed stowing down water and clearing
the deck at noon set the colors for a pilot he came
on board and got underway about one o'clock P.M. and
beat out of the harbor with a very light breeze
