The fore part of the day light breezes from the S^W
the middle part the same the latter part fresh breezes
from the S^W the ship by the wind on the Port Tack
under all sail

Remarks on Board Sunday Feb 7th
The fore part of the day strong breezes from the S^W
saw a ship steering to the S the middle and latter
parts fresh breezes and rain from the W and S^W
steering it with the main topgalant sail set
Lat 37.16 S
Long 84.14 W

Remarks on Board Monday Feb 8th
All this twentyfour hours light airs from the
S and S^W the watch employed breaking out
steering it by W under all sail
Lat 35.25 S
Long 84.46 W

Remarks on Board Tuesday Feb 9th
All this twentyfour hours moderate breezes from
the S & saw a ship to the leeward the Island
Masafuera in sight steered towards the land until
night then heeled to the wind aback on the Starboard
Tack under topsails

Remarks on Board Wednesday Feb 10th
All this twentyfour hours moderate breezes
from the S spoke and gamed with the Bark
Stella of New Bedford went in shore fishing
caught a small mess. of small fish saw two
or three Finbacks at night stood off shore
to the S^W under easy sail

All this twentyfour hours light breezes from the
S and S^W the watch employed at various jobs
the Bark stella in sight just before sun set Capt.
Howland went on board of her and got a bbl of Sea

quantities of Porpoises and one or two Finbacks the
ship by the wind on the Starboard Tack under all

All this twentyfour hours light breezes from the
S and S^W saw two or three Finbacks and several
schools of Porpoises Masafuera in sight the ship by
the wind under all sail
Lat 34.22 S

Remarks on Board Sunday Feb 14th
The fore part of the day calm the middle and
latter parts moderate breezes from the W the
ship by the wind under all sail the land in
sight
Lat 34.04 S
Long 84.29 W

Remarks on Board Monday Feb 15th
The fore part of the day strong breezes from the
W^NW and thick wet weather the middle part
the wind halled to the S the latter part fine
pleasant weather and strong breezes from the S & E
the ship by the wind on the Starboard Tack the
fore and main topsails double reefed
