The fore part of the day light breezes from the N the middle part the same named with the Bark Hellen Mar and the Bark Merlin another sail in sight to the leeward the latter part calm

Remarks on Board Thursday Feb 25th

The fore part of the day calm and foggy the middle part fine pleasant weather with a light breeze from the N three ships in sight the latter part calm saw several shoals of Porpoises

Remarks on Board Friday Feb 26th

The fore part of the day calm the middle and latter parts moderate breezes from the N W spoke the Hellen Mar and sold her some ship stores two other sails in sight the ships by the wind on the Starboard tack

Remarks on Board Saturday Feb 27th

The fore part of the day strong breezes from the N N W the middle and latter parts strong breezes and rain and heavy squalls from the S W and S of W the ship laying to under under a double reefed main topsail

Remarks on Board Sunday Feb 28th

All this twentyfour hours fine pleasant weather with a light breeze from the S S E saw a shoal of Blackfish going quick to the windward spoke and parted with the Bark B Cummings of Dartmouth the ship by the wind on the Port tack under topsails

Remarks on Board Monday Mar 1st

The fore part of the day strong breezes from the S the middle part the same saw a large number of Finbacks two sails in sight the latter part a moderate gale from the S the ship laying to on the Port tack under a double reefed main topsail and foresail

Remarks on Board Tuesday Mar 2nd

All this twentyfour hours a moderate gale from the S saw a number of Humpbacks and a shoal of Blackfish the ship by the wind on the starboard tack under short sail

Lat 36.18 S

Long 75.00 W

Remarks on Board Wednesday Mar 3rd

The fore part of the day a strong breezes from the S by E the middle part a light breeze from the S saw a Bark showing a Hamburg signal the latter part calm saw one or two Finbacks

Lat 36.30 S

Long 74.50 W

Remarks on Board Thursday Mar 4th

All this twentyfour hours fresh breezes from the S saw a Chilean Bark large quantities of Finbacks in sight about four o'clock P.M. raised land St Marys Island at seven o'clock shortened sail and lay to aback on the Port tack

Remarks on Board Friday Mar 5th

All this twentyfour hours fresh breezes from the S saw several Humpbacks and two or three sails we run down along the land from St Marys Island and at dark come to an anchor about half way
