 and James Ecklar Missing

Remarks on Board Tuesday Mar 16<sup>th</sup>  
 All this twentyfour hours light baffling winds  
 and calms the Port watch on Liberty the Starboard  
 watch employed at various jobs Robert Aldrich and  
 James Randal Missing

Remarks on Board Wednesday Mar 17<sup>th</sup>  
 All this twentyfour hours light baffling winds  
 and fog squalls all hands employed getting and  
 stowing down water

Remarks on Board Thursday Mar 18<sup>th</sup>  
 All this twentyfour hours light baffling winds  
 and calms and fog squalls all hands employed  
 stowing of the hold and getting ready for sea

Remarks on Board Friday Mar 19<sup>th</sup>  
 The fore part of the day strong breezes and  
 wet rainy weather from the N the latter part  
 calm

*on a whaling voyage in the Pacific in 1858*  
*Passage Home*

Remarks on Board Saturday Mar 20<sup>th</sup>  
 The fore part of the day fresh breezes from the S the  
 middle part the same about two o'clock P.M. got under way  
 and stood out of the bay under all sail the latter  
 part strong breezes double reefed the topsails the  
 ship by the wind on the Port tack

The Council sent a  
 man on board for a passage home when we got well off  
 clear of the land three strangers made their appearance  
 they said they had stowed themselves away on Board  
 to get a passage home

*Remarks on Board Sunday Mar 21<sup>st</sup>*

The fore part of the day strong breezes from the S  
 by the middle part much the same the latter  
 part fresh breezes from the S by E the ship by the wind  
 on the Port tack under all sail

Lat 36.02 S  
 Long 74.40 W

Remarks on Board Monday Mar 22<sup>nd</sup>  
 All this twentyfour hours light breezes from  
 the S saw a shoal of Grampasses the watch employed  
 at various jobs the ship by the wind on the Port tack  
 under all sail

Lat 36.07 S  
 Long 77.18 W

*Remarks on Board Tuesday Mar 23<sup>rd</sup>*

All this twentyfour hours light breezes from the  
 S E and E S E saw a shoal of Blackfish just  
 after daylight and lowered for them but without  
 success about three o'clock P.M. saw another shoal  
 raised them, sporting about three miles or three miles  
 and a half off, lowered and caught two the ship by  
 the wind on the Port tack under all sail bent a  
 new main royal
