the S the watch employed at various jobs the
ship by the wind working S under all sail
Two ships in sight

Remarks on Board Saturday Mar 27th
The fore part of the day light breezes from the S
the middle part the same the watch employed
at various jobs the latter part calm

Remarks on Board Sunday Mar 28th

The fore part of the day calm the middle and
latter parts fresh breezes from the S W steer
ing S under all sail

Remarks on Board Monday Mar 29th
The fore part of the day strong breezes from the S W
took in the light sails the middle part light breezes
and rain from the S the latter part strong breezes and
rain from the S E the ship by the wind on the
Port Tack under double reefed topsails

Remarks on Board Tuesday Mar 30th

The fore part of the day a strong wet gale from
the S E the ship laying to under a close reefed
main topsail the middle part the wind more to
the S the latter part strong breezes from the S
W about four o'clock P.M. Henry Devoll fell
from the fore yard while tacking the foresail and
struck on deck hurting him inwardly he bled at the
mouth nose and one ear he died in about two hours
afterwards the ship by the wind on the Starboard
Tack under double reefed topsails

Remarks on Board Wednesday Mar 31st

All this twentyfour hours strong breezes and
squalls from the Westward at ten o'clock A.M.
luffed to and buried Henry Devoll then started
S under a moderate press of sail
