 from the E and E N E all hands employed on the
 rigging lent a fore topgalant sail steering N N E under
 all sail

Remarks on Board Saturday May 1st
 All this twentyfour hours light breezes from the
 E and E by S all hands employed setting up rigging
 steering N N E under all sail saw a sail to
 the windward
 Lat 21.24 S
 Long 35.54 W

Remarks on Board Sunday May 2nd
 The fore part of the day calm the middle and
 latter parts light airs from the S W and S S W
 steering N E under all sail two sails in sight
 Lat 20.27 S
 Long 35.33 W

Remarks on Board Monday May 3rd
 All this twentyfour hours light breezes from the
 E S E and squalls from the N and N N E
 The Starboard watch employed setting up rigging the
 Port watch employed cleaning the Port cable coiled
 away a topmast standing sail boom in the splice
 steering N N E under all sail
 Lat 18.50 S
 Long 35.07 W

 All this twentyfour hours calm and warm all hands
 employed cleaning the cable and setting up rigging two sails
 in sight saw a shoal of grampasses
 Lat 18.15 S

Remarks on Board Thursday May 6th
 All this twentyfour hours light baffling winds and
 calms all hands employed cleaning the cable and
 working on the rigging steering N E by N (or trying to)
 under all sail a sail in sight
 Lat 17.26 S
 Long 35.24 W

Remarks on Board Friday May 7th
 The fore part of the day light breezes from the N E
 the middle part much the same all hands employed
 cleaning the cable and working on the rigging the latter
 part moderate breezes and rain from the E S E steer-
 ing N E by N under all sail
 Lat 16.21 S
 Long 34.53 W

Remarks on Board Saturday May 8th
 All this twentyfour hours light baffling winds and rain
 squalls all hands employed cleaning the cable and work-
 ing on the rigging saw a shoal of Blackfish and lowered for
 them but without success
 Lat 15.03 S

 The fore part of the day a very light air from the N
 N E the middle and latter parts calm and warm
 Lat 14.41 S
 Long 35.49 W
