

Remarks on board the Bark Callac Bound to the South  
Monday 10<sup>th</sup>

First part of these 24 hours light breeze from  
the S steering W S W Middle part fresh breeze  
from the various points and especially latter  
part strong breezes from the S S W heading  
to the W W under double reef topsail and ship  
in sight

Tuesday 11<sup>th</sup>

First part of these 24 hours moderate gale from  
the S S W heading to the W W under double reef  
topsail at 8 P M moderating made sail midnights  
calm latter part increasing winds from the  
W steering S at 10-30 P M anchored at and got  
Bottom in 25 fathoms of water

Wednesday 12<sup>th</sup>

First part of these 24 hours fresh breeze from  
the W steering S a great number of Hump-  
backs in sight at sundown shortened sail  
for the night latter part at daylight anchored  
and got no bottom yet double reef topsails  
and steer S W wind W and plenty of  
Humpbacks in sight

Thursday 13<sup>th</sup>

First part of these 24 hours moderate breeze  
from the W steering to the S W Middle latter  
part light air and calm 70 fathoms of water

Friday 14<sup>th</sup>

First part of these 24 hours commenced calm  
at 5 P M had a heavy tempest from the S  
hove the ship two miles east reef Main topsail  
and Spencer head to the W Middle the same  
latter part moderate breezes from the W heading  
in different tracks through the day 40 fathoms

First part of these 24 hours moderate breezes  
from the W standing in different tracks  
at sundown took in sail for the night latter  
part thick fog and the wind S steering W  
90 fathoms

First part of these 24 hours fresh breeze from  
the S steering W under double reef topsails  
at sundown took in sail for the night  
were several times through the night latter  
part light breeze and calm and thick fog  
daylight steer S wind W 47 fathoms

Monday 17<sup>th</sup>

First part of these 24 hours light breezes  
from the S steering S W by S thick and rainy  
under short sail Middle part heading by the  
wind on different tracks latter part strong  
breeze and thick fog at intervals 35 fathoms

First part of these 24 hours light breeze and  
thick fog from the S steering S W Middle  
part wind W W and much thunder and rain  
under short sail latter part strong breeze  
and fog steering S W 35 fathoms

Wednesday 19<sup>th</sup>

these 24 hours commenced with moderate breeze  
from the W and hauling to the W steering  
S W at 2-30 P M fresh gale and fog took in  
light sails and double reef at sundown  
took in sail Middle part thick fog and  
part blowing a gale from W S W heading  
to the S S W at 8 P M made sail to the  
W and closed reefed the Main and sail  
no sailing
