Thursday Dec 11th

First part of these 24 hours light breeze from
S steering W two miles in sight Middle
part head to the W under short sail latter
part light air and calm from the E steering
S S W one sail in sight

Lat 45-22 S Long 56-53
Friday Dec 12th

First part of these 24 hours light breeze from
the E steering to the S S W at 5 P.M.
upside the ship Europa of crew Bradford Middle
increasing winds from the same heading to
the E under short sail latter part a gale

Lat 46-14 S Long
Saturday Dec 13th

First part of these 24 hours a gale from the
E heading to the E Middle part the same
latter part Moderate Breeze across ship to
to the W

First part of these 24 hours strong breeze
from the E heading to the W under
double reef Middle part the same latter
latter part increasing winds from the
E heading to the W

First part of these 24 hours commence with
a heavy gale from the E heading to the W
at 5 P.M. wind shifted to the W W W and ship
to the W at 6 increasing winds taking the
Main top sail and set the Spencer Middle
the same latter part moderating set double
reef main

First part of these 24 hours with Moderate
Breeze from the W W heading to the S W
one sail in sight Middle part the same
under short sail latter part light breeze
from the W heading to the S at 10 P.M. thick
rainy double reef the top sail heading to
the W W

Wednesday 17th

First part of these 24 hours fresh breeze
from the W W heading to the W W Middle
part Moderate under short sail latter part
at daylight light breeze and fine weather
from the W head to the S S W at 9 P.M. wind
W. thick and rainy at 10 P.M. saw a school of
large Sperm Whales at 10-30 lowered and
Missell at 11 struck a whale and got the
boat. Landed and parted line at 11 struck
the first whale and drew a half hour
Storm so ended this day work

First part of these 24 hours thick fog and rain
Middle part clear latter part fresh breeze
and squally at 8 P.M. saw Sperm Whales
to the windward at 10 P.M. lowered 4 boats
at 10-30 struck one whale and lost the
line at 11 struck another and drew at
noon struck another and drew so ended
boats of and chasing

Friday Dec 19th Lat 46-09 S Long 54-55

First part of these 24 hours commence with
fresh gale and squalls from the S S W
3 boats off chasing at 1 P.M. one got
struck and parted line at 2 P.M.
the boats at 3 P.M. lowered and got the
part moderating latter part light breeze
