the S heading to the N & W Middle part
moderating latter part light breeze and
fine weather at 10 AM strong breeze
from the NW taking the light sails
heading to the NW

Thursday Jan 1st 1855

First part of these 24 hours strong breeze
heading on different tack under double
reef to sail Middle part the same latter
part moderate breeze from the NW
heading to the S at 11 AM spoke the
Barque Thurebese of Gen Bedford

Friday Jan 2nd

First part of these 24 hours strong breeze
from the S heading to the NW at
4 PM wore ship and steered by S until
8 PM taking sail and hauled up to the wind
latter part moderate breeze from the
W

Saturday 3rd

First part of these 24 hours fresh breeze
from the W heading to the E under short
sail Middle part and latter part a gale

Sunday 4th

First part of these 24 hours a gale from
the S heading to the W Middle part heading
to the E latter part light air and calm
from the S heading to the N & W and sail
in sight this morning the crew brought three
sacks of back to the galley because it was not
good to eat them

Monday Jan 5th

First part of these 24 hours moderate breeze
from the E steering S W at 1 PM spoke the
Barque America of Siskiy at 4 PM increasing
viable at a gale Middle part the same heading
to the W latter part strong breeze from
the W heading to the S & W and sail in sight

Tuesday Jan 6th

First part of these 24 hours fair breeze from
the W heading heading to the S W Middle part
wind still heading to the NW latter part
moderate breeze from the S steering N S W
under all sail

Lat 45-57 S Long 57-21 W

Wednesday Jan 7th

First part of these 24 hours moderate breeze
and rain from the S steering N S W at sunset
taking sail Middle part wind W latter part
heading to the W under double reef and
sail in sight

Lat 45-42 S Long

Thursday Jan 8th

First part of these 24 hours strong breeze
from the S heading the NW Middle
part the same latter part at 10 AM spoke
two ships a whaling steamer for them
at noon saw the whale barer and chased
fine weather

Lat 45-48 S Long

Friday Jan 9th

First part of these 24 hours light breeze
and fine weather from the W boats off Chasing
at 3 PM struck a large Sperm Whale and at
5 PM took him to the ship and at 6
PM commenced cutting at 10 AM for the night
latter part at daylight commenced cutting
at 11 PM finished
