 First part of these 24 hours fresh breeze from
 the S. steering W. by S. two sails in sight Middle
 part by the wind under short sail Latter part
 strong breeze at 5-30 A.M. and sperm whale
 going quick to windward at 7 last sight of them
 at 8 and more whales to leeward at 10 hauler
 and truck and whale at noon Baate off and
 part

Lat 45-39 Long 57-43
 Tuesday Feb 3rd

First part of these 24 hours strong breeze
 from the S at 1-30 P.M. took the whale to the
 ship and commenced cutting at 6 quit for the
 night Latter part at 4 A.M. commenced cutting
 at 10 finished cutting

Lat 45-07 Long 58-24
 Wednesday Feb 4

First part of these 24 hours Moderate breeze
 from the N. S. W. employed at hauling the line
 Middle part steering S. E. by S. employed at
 hauling Latter part the same

Lat 45-30 Long 57-41
 Thursday Feb 5th

First part of these 24 hours Moderate winds from the
 N. W. attended with thick fog employed hauling
 Middle and latter parts the same under short sail
 heading S. W.

Friday Feb 6th

First part Moderate winds from the N. W. with fog and
 short sail heading to the S. W. employed hauling Middle
 part the same Latter part finished hauling and commenced
 to stow down under short sail heading to the S. W.

 Saturday Feb 7th

First part of these 24 hours Moderate winds from the N. W.
 heading S. W. under short sail employed stowing down. Middle
 part wind shifted to the S. E. with rain. Latter part wind
 from the same quarter with rain employed stowing down. Nothing
 in sight or ends

Sunday Feb 8th

First part of these 24 hours Moderate sails from the S. E.
 heading S. W. under short sail employed stowing down
 at 4 P.M. finished with rain. Middle part much the same
 latter part wind from the W. N. W. under all sail standing
 to the N. W.

Monday Feb 9th

First part of these 24 hours strong winds from the N. W.
 heading to the N. W. under all sail at 3 O. CLK. P.M. spoke
 the *Odyssey* of Oreg Harbor. one whale this season at 3 P.M.
 spoke the *Falcon* of West Beaufort. one whale. Double under
 the topsails Middle part the wind Moderated. Latter part at 10
 O. CLK. A.M. made all sail with light air from the S. E.
 and two sails in sight at 1 P.M. more ships bearing
 S. E. employed breaking out the after hold. Or ends

Tuesday Feb 10th

First part of these 24 hours light and pleasant winds from
 the S. W. under all sail at 3 O. CLK. P.M. under the jibs
 and double under the topsails at 4 P.M. under the *Anders*
 and *Fontenels* and close under the *Main* sail wind here
 came to the N. heading West blowing quite fresh
 Middle part wind shifted to the W. S. W. (one ship heading
 N. W. at daylight made sail. Double under topsails. Latter
 part Moderate winds from S. W. heading N. W. at 1 P.M.
 O. CLK. stowed down the *Main* sail to repair. Nothing in sight
 or ends
