

Wednesday 3rd

First part moderate winds from the N.E. with fine weather all hands employed getting water & returning the same.

Thursday 4th

First part of this day moderate winds from the N.E. with fine weather all hands employed getting off wood & returning away.

Friday 5th

First part light & variable winds. employed storming down wood &c.

Saturday 6th

First part moderate winds from the N.E. with fine weather.

Sunday 7th

First part light winds from the N.E. with fine weather. at anchor. already for day

Monday 8th

First part light winds from the N.E. with fine weather.

Tuesday 9th

First part light winds from the N.E. with fine weather. Middle part the same. at 4 am got under way & dropped anchor again. at 8 o'clock took on anchor and made sail with moderate winds from the N.E.

Wednesday Aug 12th

First part of these 24 hours fresh breezes from the N.E. standing out of the Bay. at 10 AM cleared the Heads and steered E.S.E. under easy sail and stood on shore at sunset land 35 miles distant Middle part fresh breezes latter part the same steering E.S.E. and the ship's back.

Lat 11 S Long

Thursday Aug 13th

First part of these 24 hours moderate breezes from the N.E. steering E.S.E. at 4 PM the wind shifted to the S. braced up and head E.S.E. Middle part strong gale the ship under short sail latter part set double reef topsails and courses heading E and sail in sight this day two men made their appearance on deck that had stranded themselves away.

Lat 29-08 S Long

Friday Aug 14th

First part of these 24 hours strong winds from the S.E. heading by the wind to the N.E. Middle part the same latter part wind E at 3 PM were ship to the S.E. under sail weather looking bad.

Lat 28-49 S Long

Saturday Aug 15th

First part of these 24 hours strong breezes from the S.E. heading S.E. by S Middle part wind N.E. steering S.E. latter part the same and two sails.

Lat 30-10 S Long

Sunday Aug 16th

First part of these 24 hours strong breezes from the N.E. steering S.E. by S at sunset shortened sail and huffed by the wind to the S. Middle part the same latter part set double reef topsails were ship and steered N.E. & W.

Lat 30-59 S Long

Monday Aug 17th

At 11 these 24 hours strong breezes from the N.E. heading to the S.E. under short sail thick weather.
