

Remarks on Board of the *Albatross* Atlantic Ocean  
Thursday November 12<sup>th</sup>

First part Moderate winds from the S.W. with the  
weather. employed boring Nothing to be seen in shape  
of Whales. J. G. Gath<sup>er</sup> water. Middle part the same. Latter  
part light breeze from the East & fine weather. steering to the  
S.W. under all sail employed showing down Oil & boiling  
ends

Friday November 13<sup>th</sup>

First part light & pleasant winds from the E. & fine clear  
weather. standing to the S.W. employed showing down Oil  
& boiling. Middle part the same. at 10 P.M. finished boring  
latter part Moderate winds from the N.W. standing to the  
S.W. at 6 P.M. A.M. saw a Right Whale at 6 P.M.  
coming away. & gave chase at 8 P.M. the Caribbea Boat  
struck & killed the Whale. at 11 P.M. brought him on side  
the Gath<sup>er</sup> water. One sail in sight Latitude 39.26  
Longitude 53.40

Saturday November 14<sup>th</sup>

First part light & pleasant winds from the N.E. & fine  
weather. employed cutting the Whale. at 4 P.M. finished  
middle part the same. employed cleaning an  
the boat & getting ready for boiling at 1 P.M. killed the whale  
latter part light winds & pleasant weather. standing to the  
N.W. under easy sail employed boring

Sunday November 15<sup>th</sup>

First part of the day light & pleasant winds from the N.W. &  
standing to the N.W. under easy sail employed boring and  
showing down oil. Middle part the same. latter part Moderate  
N.E. winds and thick weather. employed boring & breaking out  
for Rigs shoots as ends. Latitude 39.15

Monday Nov 16<sup>th</sup>

First part strong winds from the N.E. & thick fog employed boring  
and showing down. heading to the N.W. at 10 P.M. finished  
the fore sail & fine weather. under easy sail no ship in sight  
steering to the S.W. under all sail Middle part blowing strong  
at 10 P.M. finished boring latter part strong breeze from North.  
Rain & fog under the N. fore sail No obs

Remarks on Board of the *Albatross* Atlantic Ocean  
Tuesday November 17<sup>th</sup>

First part Moderate winds from the North with much rain & fog  
employed showing down Oil at 5 P.M. One sail in sight  
standing to the Eastward at 6 P.M. saw the *Albatross* Double  
under Middle part the same. latter part strong breeze from the N.W.  
heading to the N.E. at 9 P.M. spoke the *Albatross* as before of  
the Bedford one whale this season employed scraping Bone.

Wednesday November 18<sup>th</sup>

First part Moderate winds from the N.W. standing to the N.E.  
employed on the bone. one sail in sight at 6 P.M. saw  
ship heading to the S.W. under all sail. Middle part the  
same. latter part light breeze from the N.E. & fine weather one sail  
in sight employed showing down Oil in the fore part. Bore.

Thursday November 19<sup>th</sup>

First part fine weather & light winds from the N.E. steering  
to the S.W. under all sail employed showing down Oil at  
5 P.M. saw 3 Right Whales. gave chase. coming away  
and gave chase without success. J. G. Gath<sup>er</sup> water. One  
sail in sight. Middle part the same. latter part strong wind  
from the S.W. in the evening E.S.E. at 6 P.M. saw Right  
Whale at 7 P.M. coming away. and gave chase at 7 P.M. Caribbea  
Boat struck Whale going quick to the under way. employed  
working ship towards the Boat then sail in sight

First part strong winds from the North & fine weather employed  
working ship towards the Boat at 3 P.M. Boat brought the  
Whale along side J. G. Gath<sup>er</sup> water Middle part the same  
latter part strong winds from the South & a heavy mist  
at 4 P.M. Announced cutting the Whale at 4  
P.M. steering N. in order to cut One sail in sight
