Middle part wind much the same. at 2 A.M. wind hauled to the N.
Latter part fresh breeze from the N.W. & clear weather set
double reefed J. Tapscott steering W.S.W. Nothing in sight

Tuesday December 6th

This day fresh breeze from the N.W. with fine clear weather
steering W.S.W. Under double reefed J. Tapscott. Present 10.00
M. Spencer at 1.00 P.M. our ship heading N.E. at 4.00
P.M. J. Tapscott & J. Tapscott & close reefed M. Tapscott. Middle
part the same. Latter part set double reefed J. Tapscott
steering N.E. with a pleasant wind from the W.

Wednesday, December 7th

This day begins with a fresh breeze from the Westward
and fair weather. Steering N.E. under full sails. Nothing
in sight. at 1 P.M. steering S. Middle part light breeze
latter part made sail with light wind from the N.W. & fine
weather. at 7 A.M. wind from the E. at 9 A.M. wind hauled to
the S. & fresh in the wind to the E by S. with double reefed
J. Tapscott & J. Tapscott.

This day begins with a fresh breeze from the S. & clear
weather. in the wind to the E. under reefed J. Tapscott and
J. Tapscott at 4 P.M. wind gradually hauling to the S.W.
at 7 P.M. wind out S.W. steering E.S.E. under full sails
middle part. moderate winds from the W. steering E.S.E.
at 2.00 A.M. saw the land. latter part strong winds
from the West with frequent hail & rain squalls. running
down along the land.

double reefed J. Tapscott & J. Tapscott running along the land at

wind moderating. & hauls to the S.W. our ship heading South.
set double reefed M. Tapscott & J. Tapscott. Land distant 20 miles
middle part. moderate breeze & West. at 9 A.M. saw the light
on Cape Rembrak set double reefed J. Tapscott. & a dingy to
the passage. latter part light winds from the West. beating
up the bay. at 7 A.M. took the Pilot at 8.00 P.M. came to
Anchor in Port Stanley in 3 1/2 fathoms. J. Tapscott & J. Tapscott

beating up for fresh water. Cattle. Middle part some little
rain. latter part southerly wind & some little fog. put on
raft of water & stored down

This day strong southerly hail with frequent hail squalls
middle part much the same. latter part moderate southerly
wind & fine weather. Starboard watch on liberty

Tuesday December 13th

This day begins with moderate winds from the W. & fine
weather. Middle & latter part much the same. Starboard
watch on liberty

Wednesday December 14th

This day fine weather. middle part the same. latter
part calm weather. Starboard watch on liberty took
out for salt fishing

Thursday December 15th

This day light & variable winds fine weather. Middle
latter part the same. Starboard watch on liberty
