Sunday March 12th

First part fresh breeze from the ENE. fine weather. Under what's topsails heading N. at 1 P.M. don't's reefed. the H. topsails and P.M. don't's reefed the M. topsails. Watch briefly employed in ship's duty at sunset worn ship heading S.E. & shortened sail for the night. Middle part the same. Latter part fresh breeze from the N.E. heading Eby S. Under don't's reefed H. topsail & close reefed. H. topsails & H. courses. Nothing in sight. one man off duty

Monday March 13th

First part fresh breeze from the N.E. & cloudy weather. Under easy sail heading Eby S. at 4 P.M. close reefed. M. topsail & foremast sails at 7 P.M. reefed the H. topsails. Middle part wind died away. Latter part light breeze from the N.W. & fine weather. Made all sail heading W. the Carpenter & Blacksmiths briefly employed. Nothing in sight at 10 A.M. worn ship heading N.E.

Tuesday March 14th

First part light air from the N.W. & fine weather. Heading N.E. under full sail. sent in the sentinels staysails to repair at 4 P.M. bent it again. Watch briefly employed in various duties adjacent to the ship for the night. Middle part the same. Latter part moderate breeze from the S.W. under full sail. steering E. one sail in sight spoke the "Alho". one man off duty

First part light breeze from the S.W. & fine weather steering E. under full sail. one sail in sight at 4 P.M. took in sail for the night and hauled the Southward middle & latter part much the same. Latter part fresh breeze from the N.E. & cloudy weather. Worn ship heading ENE. under shortensail one sail in sight. one man off duty

First part fresh breeze from the N. with dark cloudy weather. attended with frequent rain squalls. Heading ENE. under easy sail at 4 P.M. wind changed. Suddenly to the N.W. worn ship heading N. two sails in sight. Middle part wind from the S.W. & strong under shortensail. Latter part strong gale from the S.W. under close reefed. H. topsail & storm sails heading W.S.W. one man off duty

First part blowing strong gale from the S.W. with clear weather. Under easy sail heading W.S.W. on sail in sight steering to the N.E. Middle part moderated & hauled to the S. & fine weather. Latter part made sail with a fine breeze from the S. on the wind. Heading W.S.W. one sail in sight standing to the N.E. Watch briefly employed in ship's duty. one man off duty

First part moderate breeze from the S & fine weather. Under don't's reefed. H. topsails & courses. heading W.S.W. watch briefly employed. at 7 P.M. took in sail for the night. Middle part the same. Latter part moderate breeze from the ESE & fine weather steering S.W. under full sail. Nothing in sight. one man off duty
