First part fresh breeze from the S.W. & squally
under. Doubt ref. topsails & Mains. Heading
West at 4.00 PM. fine. Topsails & Mains
refined. S. Mains. wind blowing heavy in squalls
at 7.00 PM. Handed. S. Mains. Middle part the
same. Latter part wind S.E. & fresh. under easy
sail steering S.E. at 10.00 AM. the S. Mains down to repair
and bent. Weather fine.

steering S.E. under full sail. Nothing in sight at
sunset. Shortened sail for the night & luffed to the
wind heading S.W. Middle & latter part the same

several whales. former and some Chas. whales going quick
to the windward. at Noon the B.B. struck. broke off
the tail.

This day strong breeze from the S.E. & fine weather. Under
full sail. to a large sperm whale. employed over the
ship to the windward at 10.00 PM. took the whale

for the night. Middle part the same. Latter part light wind
from the S.E. & fine weather at daylight commenced cutting
two sail in sight

Saturday March 25th

First part light wind from the S.E. & fine weather
employed cutting at 3.00 PM. fine. commenced
bailing the case at 7.00 PM. started the works. Ship under

steering to the S and E. employed boiling

breeze & much rain attended with thunder & lightning
employed boiling under easy sail
