the Second Branch to the consideration of the
first Branch was read and referred to Messrs
William Smith and Sulzby.

The Committee on the Petition of Thomas Hollings-
worth and others reported a bill entitled
an ordinance to regulate the measuring
and weighing of grain flour and meal in
the City of Baltimore and other purposes
therein mentioned, was read a first time
and ordered to lie on the table.
