The Committee appointed to bring in a bill respecting the wells and pumps reported a bill entitled an ordinance to regulate the sinking of wells and erecting and repairing pumps in the City of Baltimore and to repeal the ordinance therein mentioned which being read a first time was ordered to lie on the table.

The following resolution was received from the Second Branch of the City Council -

Resolved by the first and second Branch of the City Council that the Mayor be authorized to rent ^{a house} for the accommodation of the Superintendent of the Powder Magazine and that an appropriation of a sum not exceeding one hundred dollars shall be made for that purpose in the ordinance making appropriations for the year eighteen hundred and four.

The Bill entitled a supplement to the ordinance to regulate the measuring and weighing of grain flour and meal in the City of Baltimore and for other purposes therein mentioned was read a second time and passed with amendments.

On motion the Branch adjourned until tomorrow afternoon at 3 o'clock.
