That they have received a Statement from the City Collector by which it appears that there is due to the different payers the sum of \$1686.80 including that which is due to the Petitioner. They therefore conceive that it would be inexpedient to make at this time any partial appropriation, but submit to the Council the propriety of discharging the whole of the claims, all of which appear to your Committee to stand on the same footing.

And your Committee further report that the Petitioner has leave to withdraw his Petition.
