

On motion Mr. Stauffer was added to the Committee appointed on the Inspection Laws. The Committee to whom was committed the Bill for inspecting Slaves and Heading reported a Bill Entitled an Ordinance for the Inspection of Slaves and Heading in the City of Baltimore and to repeal the ordinance therein mentioned, which being read a first and by special order a second time passed and was thereupon transmitted to the Second Branch: which Bill was returned by the Second Branch passed with an amendment and the amendment being read in the first Branch was concurred with.

The following Resolution was transmitted to the Second Branch.

Resolved by the first and second Branch of the City Council that four hundred Dollars be appropriated for paving the space at the Intersection of Howard and Franklin Streets and entered in the appropriation Bill for the year 1804.

The following Resolution was transmitted to

the second Branch.

Resolved by the first and second Branch of the City Council that the Mayor be requested to procure at the expense of the corporation one copy of each of the different <sup>Inspection</sup> Laws now existing in the State of Pennsylvania New York and Massachusetts for the use of the corporation and lay the same before them at their next session.
