

<sup>74</sup> An ordinance for increasing the number of Lamps in the City of Baltimore was read a first time and by special order a second time and well passed, and was thereupon transmitted to the second Branch.

The ordinance to protect Trees planted in the Streets Lanes and allies in the City of Baltimore was returned by the second Branch passed.

The Committee appointed on the Petition of Beeman and Cole reported the following resolution.

Resolved by the first and second Branch of the City Council that the sum of seventy four Dollars and two cents a balance due James Beeman and Thomas Cole as Commissioners to build a public wharf at the south end of Bond Street Fells point be included in the ordinance making appropriations for the year eighteen hundred and four,

which resolution was read and concurred with, and thereupon transmitted to the second Branch and by them returned agreed to.

<sup>73</sup> The Committee appointed on the Inspection Laws reported a Bill respecting salted provisions imported into and exported from the City of Baltimore which was read a first time and ordered to lie on the Table.

On motion a Bill entitled a further supplement to an Ordinance for the safe keeping of Gun powder within the City of Baltimore &c was read a first time and ordered to lie on the Table.

On motion the Branch adjourned until to morrow afternoon at three O'clock.
