The Branch met agreeably to adjournment.

The Petition of John Leaky and others was read and
ordered to lie on the table.

on motion therefor leave was given to bring in
a bill entitled an ordinance for the inspection
of plastering taths which being read a first
time was ordered to lie on the table.

The ordinance farther to preserve the health of the
City of Baltimore was read a second time
and will not pass.

The bill entitled an ordinance appropriating several
sums of money for the purposes hereafter
mentioned was returned by the Second Branch
not passed.

A resolution was received from the Second Branch
requesting the concurrence of the first Branch
to the including the sum of five hundred and
fifty Dollars in the ordinance making appro-
priations for the year 1805, to be applied to
the purposes therein mentioned, which resolution
being read and agreed to was returned to the Second
branch.

A resolution was laid on the table directing the sum ¹⁶⁹
of two hundred dollars to be included in the ordinance
making appropriations for the year 1805 to be ex-
pended in the manner therein mentioned
which resolution was read, ordered ^{to lie on the table} and Messrs.
Tennant Lorman and Jepsop appointed a
Committee to take into consideration the
subject matter thereof.

The Petition of David Barkman and others was
read and ordered to lie on the table.

The Committee appointed on the Petition of Job
Smith and others made a report which being
read was agreed to.

A resolution was laid on the table directing that the
sum of one hundred and fifty Dollars be in-
cluded in the ordinance making appropriations
for the year 1805 which in addition to the sum
heretofore granted was to be applied in erecting
a footway across Harford Street, which resolu-
tion being read was concurred with.

The Committee appointed on the Petition of George Kri-
ncker & others reported a resolution for including
in the ordinance making appropriations for the
year 1805 the sum of sixty Dollars to provide step-
ping stones to be set up in Liberty Street at
its intersections with Baltimore, Fayette & German
Streets which resolution being read was
