The Petition of Isaac Calderston & others was read and referred to Messrs. Machenheimer Miller and Small.

The ordinance for the inspection of plastering laths was read a second time and passed and thereupon was transmitted to the Second Branch.

The ordinance to appropriate a sum of money for the finishing the Town Clock and alarm Bell was read a second time and passed and thereupon was transmitted to the Second Branch.

The bill entitled an ordinance to continue the several ordinances therein mentioned was received from the Second Branch read a first and by special order a second time and passed and was then returned to the Second Branch.

The following message was received from the Second Branch.
