The Branch met agreeably to adjournment.

The Committee to whom was committed the bill entitled an ordinance to authorize the City Commissioners to repair that part of Howard Street which lies between Baltimore and Lexington Street reported a new bill entitled a Supplement to an ordinance entitled an ordinance to improve the foot-pavements in the City of Baltimore passed 22<sup>nd</sup> March 1802, <sup>which</sup> was read a first ~~and by special order a second time and passed and thereupon was transmitted to the Second Branch~~ time and ordered to lie on the table.

On motion therefor leave was given to bring in a bill entitled an additional supplement to the ordinance entitled an ordinance for the inspection of salted provisions imported into and exported from the City of Baltimore, which being read a first was by special order read a second time and passed and thereupon was transmitted to the Second Branch and by them returned passed.

The Committee appointed on the first subject of the report of the joint Committee on the Mayor's Communication to the City Council at the commencement of their present session reported a bill entitled an ordinance for the appointment of a Health Officer at the Port of Baltimore and to repeal the ordinance therein mentioned which was read a first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The Committee appointed on the Communication of Jehu Boutwell made a report which being read was agreed to and transmitted to the Second Branch.

The Bill entitled an ordinance to provide for the inspection and measurement of buildings erected within the City of Baltimore was read a second time and will not pass but a motion being made and agreed to for a reconsideration the bill was ordered to lie on the table.

A communication was received from the Mayor which was read and referred to the consideration of Messrs. Miller, Moore and Mackenheimer.

A communication from the City Commissioners was read and referred to Mr. Hillen.
