The Bill entitled an ordinance appropriating a sum of money for repairing a wharf at the west end of Pitt Street in the sixth ward was read a second time and will not pass.

A resolution for publishing the summary of monies received and expended between the first day of February 1804 and the first day of February 1805 in the daily papers of the City was read and agreed to.

The bill entitled an ordinance to provide for the inspection and measurement of buildings erected within the City of Baltimore was read a second time and the question being taken on its passage the yeas and nays were called for and appeared as follows:
