The Branch met agreeably to adjournment.

The bill entitled an ordinance for the regulation of the several markets within the City of Baltimore was read a second time and passed with an amendment and thereupon returned to the Second Branch which amendment the Second Branch informed the first Branch they had concurred in.

The bill entitled an ordinance for the appointment of a Health Officer at the Port of Baltimore and to repeal the ordinance therein mentioned was read a second time and passed and thereupon transmitted to the Second Branch together with the bill entitled an ordinance for the due performance of Quarantine at the Port of Baltimore and to repeal the ordinance therein mentioned and the bill entitled an ordinance to provide for the inspection and measurement of buildings erected within the City of Baltimore.

The bill entitled an ordinance to repeal a Supplement to the ordinance entitled an ordinance for regulating the sinking of wells and erecting and repairing pumps within the City of Baltimore was read a second time and will not pass.

The bill entitled an ordinance for the more effectual prevention and extinguishment of fires within the City of Baltimore was read a second time and the questions taken on its passage the yeas & nays were called for and appeared as follows

On motion leave was given to bring in a bill entitled an ordinance for the aid and encouragement of the several fire companies in the City of Baltimore which was read a first time and ordered to lie on the table.
