The resolution for purchasing Jehu Boulden's land if
any he may have adjoining the Hospital Lot
was returned by the Second Branch agreed to.

The resolution for including in the ordinance making
appropriations for the year 1805 the sum of six hundred
dollars for removing the wooden kerbs in the 6th ward
and for replacing the same with stone was agreed
to and sent to the Second Branch and by them
returned agreed to.

The Committee on the Communication of Job Smith
made a report which was read and agreed to
and thereupon transmitted to the Second Branch
and by returned agreed to.

The Report of the Committee on the subject of
McClery Street was returned by the Second
Branch agreed to.

A resolution for including in the ordinance making
appropriations for the year 1805 the sum of five hundred
and thirty nine dollars and twenty cents for reimbursing
Stephen Colver for the like sum by him paid into the
city treasury on account mud sold to Cumberland
Dugan and Thomas Mcclery and by them y^t sent
for was read, agreed to and transmitted to the
Second Branch and by them returned agreed to.

The Committee on the Communication of Joseph Smith
Harbor Master made a report which was read
and agreed to.

A resolution authorizing the Mayor to direct the Super-
-intendant of the mud machine to clear out
all sand dirt or filth washed or conducted into
the basin by drains or sewers from any of the paved
streets of the City was received from the Second
Branch read and agreed to and thereupon returned
to the Second Branch.

A resolution authorizing the Mayor to direct the Super-
-intendant of the mud machine to deepen the
water from the south side of the Channel from
the point where the same is now deepened to
agreeably to ordinances in a diagonal direction
until they get to ten feet water in ordinary tides
was received from the Second Branch read, agreed
to and returned to the Second Branch.

The bill entitled an ordinance making appropriations
for the year 1805 was read a first and by special
order a second time and passed with amendments
and thereupon transmitted to the Second Branch.
